She had been living in Manchester all her life. 20 · For something we had done several times up to a point in the past and continued to do after that point: · He was a wonderful quitarist. He had been playing 25 ever since he was twelve. · He had written three novels and he was working on another one · When we are reporting our experience and including up to the (then) present: 30 · My 21st birthday was the worst day I had ever had. · I was pleased to meet Christopher. I hadn't met him before, even though I had met his wife several times.
